The encyclopædia britannica (latin for "british encyclopaedia"), formerly published by encyclopædia britannica, inc., is a general knowledge english-language encyclopaedia was written by about 100 full-time editors and more than 4,000 contributors. the 2010 version of the 15th edition, which spans 32 volumes and 32,640 pages, was the last printed edition. Encyclopaedia: encyclopaedia, reference work that contains information on all branches of knowledge or that treats a particular branch of knowledge in a comprehensive manner. for more than 2,000 years encyclopaedias have existed as summaries of extant scholarship in forms comprehensible to their readers. the word The britannica was the idea of colin macfarquhar, a bookseller and printer, and andrew bell, an engraver, both of edinburgh they conceived of the britannica as a conservative reaction to the french encyclopédie of denis diderot (published 1751–1766), which was widely viewed as heretical. ironically, the encyclopédie had begun as a french translation of the popular english encyclopedia
