We acknowledge the aboriginal and torres strait islander peoples of australia as the traditional owners and custodians of the land of our schools. History what does naidoc stand for? naidoc stands for national aboriginal and torres strait islander day observance committee. the acronym for this committee "naidoc" has now become commonly known as a weeklong aboriginal and torres strait islander cultural festival celebrated annually in the first full week of july. Victorian aborigines, the indigenous australians of victoria, australia, occupied the land for tens of thousands of years prior to european settlement. according to gary presland, aboriginal people have lived in victoria for about 40,000 years living a semi-nomadic existence of fishing, hunting and gathering, and farming eels.. the aboriginal people of victoria had developed a varied and Australian aboriginal religion and mythology (also known as dreamtime or dreaming stories, songlines, or aboriginal oral literature) are the stories traditionally performed by aboriginal peoples within each of the language groups across australia.. all such myths variously "tell significant truths within each aboriginal group's local landscape effectively layer the whole of the Australian aborigines - indigenous australians. indigenous australians are the aboriginal and torres strait islander people of australia, descended from groups that existed in australia and surrounding islands prior to european colonization." red tent australia acknowledges aboriginal and torres strait islander peoples as the traditional custodians and first peoples of australia. rta recognises the impacts of colonisation and dispossession and the contemporary disadvantage experienced by aboriginal and torres strait islander peoples. Aboriginal and torres strait islander viewers are advised that this website contains images and voices of people who have died. the story of aboriginal sydney could not be told without recognising their achievements.
